The Special Activities Committee also purchased a bench for the beach and more picnic tables. John has painted the front panel on the pavilion and he has also repaired or replaced the doors to the outhouses with some help from Kirt Kandler. Bea Gilbert and Sue and Steve Dues have made the park even prettier with their additions of flowers and shrubs. They have put many long hours into keeping them trimmed and watered. Thank you to all who helped on any of the projects.

Since we only have spring and fall signs for the lake, Sue Dues was given permission by the board to purchase two new signs for winter and summer.

Lisa Johnson and Renee McSween have agreed to take over Special Activities and organize all the activities and dates for the lake, including activities, holidays, breakfasts, etc. Team leaders and helpers are still needed. Lisa and Renee will help remind those that have signed up for an activity and help in organization if needed. A big thank you goes to Gary and Cathy Moubray for chairing the Special Activities Committee for the last several years.

The Fish Committee released the new fish into the lake on Oct 13. Mike Johnson has stepped down from chairing the Fish committee and Harry Loiselle is replacing him. Thanks Mike for your service.

Shari Scheibling has started recycling plastic for the lake and it is going well enough that she has agreed to continue next year. Please recycle your #1 & #2 plastic at lot #124 in the barrel out front. Thanks Shari for helping us go green!

Reminders:

- After the park is closed, you must call John to make arrangements to come out and have your electric turned on. The park has the right to charge individuals for use of the electric during the months the park is closed.
- No outside rubbish should be brought in and put in our dumpsters. Yard waste is not allowed, nor is anything else prohibited by Waste Management, such as paint, tires, batteries, large appliances, etc.
- No garbage or unburnable material in the burn pile in the meadow. Lumber and yard waste are acceptable, if it's something else and you're unsure please ask. Yard clippings, leaves, and fire pit ash should go to the area north/northeast of the burn pile.
- Please help hold our electric costs down by turning off air conditioners, heaters, lights, electric water heaters, etc., when not in use.

October 31st:

2013 dues are due.

November 1st:

The electric will be turned off.
